Rob Strong writes: Michael Wild's fast group was excellent. It was a large group in VCN jerseys and many other riders joined us for all or part of the ride. Everyone rode well. I think a few dropped off near the end, but we still had a lot ride over the finish line together, and got a mention by the man in the yellow suit.

We had one accident between Reepham and the coast when new member Allan (from Barnsley) on a carbon Planet-X was forced onto the sandy verge by an on-coming car and came down, with a couple of others. Everyone stopped, and Allan was able to continue with us, albeit with a buckled front wheel which he got trued at the Sheringham stop.

Only one puncture, me, shortly after Sheringham, when again everyone stopped, so many thanks to all the other riders.

We completed the event in 4 hours 40 mins cycling time, an average of 21mph. Well done and thanks to Michael Wild for organising and marshalling a great ride.

Trevor Matsell and his partner Michelle rode the 100 on their tandem, and I think got a really good time. You might want to check with him. David Davies and Jill Fisher rode the 50 on a tandem also.

Saw plenty of other VCN riders out during the event or at the end. I would say altogether a very good day, and a good advert for the club.

And this from Paul Alcock: I am not a regular Sunday morning rider due to other commitments so I've not had the pleasure of riding with many of the folks. Although the fast group was a big group and attracted some non-club riders, they were respectful of everyone in it, stopped for punctures and made sure it finished as a group. 
Will and Neil - the TT Centurions

Two weeks before we were all thinking how well we had done to get round the 100, Neil Vaughan and Will Bamber showed how fast it should be done. It was North Norfolk Wheelers 100 TT. I'm told it was Will's first 100 TT, he finished in 4:14:49, securing third place and a Gold standard time at the first time of asking. So. How was it for you, Will?

It was my first 100 TT, but this year my training has been geared towards longer events. The single carriageway course west of Fakenham covered nearly 3 circuits with 300m of climbing per lap. The weather was warm with a moderate northerly wind. I started number 10, although the first 5 riders were tricycles. By 20 miles I had caught all the riders in front of me and rode the next 80 miles only seeing marshals at junctions. Not knowing how I would hold TT speed for 100 miles, I had a controlled first lap, then raised the pace for the second lap. The only objective was to achieve the VCN gold standard of 4:20:00! The wind seemed to pick up towards the end and I dropped from 24mph average to a 23mph average for the final 25 miles. I crossed the line in 4:14:49.

We're getting on well the NNW at the moment, they were well pleased with the VCN contingent turning out for their last Club 10 TT which saw Keiron Cole record a PB 26.06. A good outing too for VC Norwich in the Breckland CC Slowest 60 Open TT. No, I don't get the slowest bit either.

VCN second claim rider Scott Davison (riding for Velo Velocity.co.uk) was fastest overall with 21:37. Karl Read was 13th less than a minute back and Sally Witey took the women's prize with a 24:13 PB. Markos Janes almost broke 25 with a PB of his own.
